


Your Final Destiny...



What does the Hebrew Bible say about it?

And you shall seek Me, and find Me, when you shall search for Me with all your heart. Jeremiah 29:13

The Holy Scriptures teach us how to have eternal life and peace with God.

God is Holy and the source of eternal life

Isaiah 5:16: But the LORD of hosts shall be exalted in judgment, and God that is holy shall be sanctified in righteousness.

Psalm 16:11: You will show me the path of life; In Your presence is fullness of joy; At Your right hand are pleasures forevermore.

All have Sinned

Isaiah 59:2: But your iniquities have separated you from your God; And your sins have hidden *His* face from you, so that He will not hear.

Ecclesiastes 7:20: For there is not a just man upon earth, that does good, and sins not.

Isaiah 64:6: All our righteous acts are like filthy rags.

Ezekiel 18:4: The soul who sins will die.

Hebrews 9:27: And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment:

Daniel 12:2: And many of them that sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt.

Removing the sin barrier requires blood atonement

Leviticus 17:11: For the life of the flesh is in the blood: and I have given it to you upon the altar to make an atonement for your souls: for it is the blood that makes an atonement for the soul.

In the past, God temporarily atoned for man's sin by implementing the Levitical animal sacrificial system pointing forward to the perfect and final sacrifice for sin made by Messiah Himself (Leviticus chapters 1-7).

God promised to send the Messiah to provide that atonement

Psalm 2:7: "I will declare the decree: The Lord has said to Me, 'You are My Son,

Psalm 2:12: Do homage to the Son, lest He become angry, and you perish in the way, for His wrath may soon be kindled. Blessed are all they who take refuge in Him.

The Messiahship of Yeshua/Jesus

From the very beginning, the Holy Scriptures (Tenach) promised a Messiah (Genesis 3:15), a Savior for both Jews and Gentiles (Isaiah 49:6). Tenach reveals precise credentials of the Messiah so that we may recognize him.

Tenach Messianic Prophecies

Messiah would be from the tribe of Judah (Genesis 49:10), a descendant from the family of David (Jeremiah 23:5-6), and born of a virgin (Isaiah 7:14) in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2). His triumphal entry into Jerusalem fulfilled the prophecy in Zechariah 9:9. He would be betrayed by a friend (Psalm 41:9) and sold for 30 pieces of silver (Zechariah 11:13). In **Isaiah 53**, we read about the details of Yeshua's sufferings. He would be wounded for our sins and transgressions, his hands and feet would be pierced. He would suffer and die (Isaiah 53:9) as an atoning sacrifice prior to the destruction of the Temple by the Romans in 70 CE (AD) (Daniel 9:24-26). Not a single bone would be broken (Psalm 34:20). He would be resurrected (Psalm 16:10).

The New Covenant (Brit-Chadashah) reveals the fulfillment of prophecy in Yeshua (Jesus)

Yeshua was from the tribe of Judah (Luke 3:33), the family of David (Luke 3:31) and born of a virgin in Bethlehem (Matthew 1:18-23, 2:1). He **was** betrayed by a friend (John 18:5, Mark 14: 17-18) and **sold** for 30 pieces of silver (Matthew 26:15). He **did** suffer and die (Matthew 27:33-56) as an atoning sacrifice prior to the destruction of the Temple in 70 CE (AD). Not a single bone of Yeshua was broken during His scourging, the crucifixion itself, nor by the Roman soldiers who broke the other victim's legs (John 19:36). He **was** resurrected through providing salvation for Jew and Gentile (Matthew 28:1-20).

Messiah was crucified on Passover, and his body, the sinless bread of life, was broken and buried during the Feast of Unleavened Bread. Three days later, he was raised to life on the Feast of Firstfruits. God's plan of redemption was perfectly timed and it was God's plan all along for Messiah to suffer, die and be resurrected as an atonement for our sins (Genesis 3:15, Isaiah 53, Psalm 16:10).

God's final atonement fulfilled in Yeshua/Jesus

Isaiah 53:5-12: ⁵ But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: ⁶ ... and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all. ⁷ ... he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, ¹² ... and he bare the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

Hebrews 9:12: Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by his own blood he entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us (New Covenant).

1 Corinthians 15:3-4: ... how that Messiah died for our sins according to the scriptures; ⁴ And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures: (New Covenant).

Romans 5:9: ... being now justified by his blood, we shall be saved from wrath through him (New Covenant).

Salvation by Faith

We must believe God as our father Abraham did

Genesis 15:6: And he (Abraham) believed in the LORD; and he counted it to him for righteousness.

Habakkuk 2:4: ... but the just shall live by his faith.

John 3:16: For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in him should not perish, but have everlasting life (NC).

John 6:29: Jesus answered and said unto them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in Him whom he has sent (NC)."

John 3:36: He that believes on the Son has everlasting life; and he that believes not the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him (NC).

The God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob sent His Son Messiah Yeshua (Jesus) to provide the ultimate blood atonement for the remission of sin. He died, was buried and resurrected through providing salvation for both Jews and Gentiles who accept His final atoning sacrifice for the forgiveness of their sins.

Believe in Jesus-Yeshua, God's promised Messiah, and the moment you do, like Abraham, God counts your faith as righteousness and gives you the gift of eternal life and peace with God. Shalom
