As far as He is concerned, Christ paid the entire debt for your sin. For you to offer to pay more is an insult to God.

You really don't save anything if you use a coupon to buy something that you do not want. So, you might be thinking. Why should I cash in God's coupon for eternal life. I'm not sure I need it or even want it.

We really don't know what will happen to us after we die, but God does; and He has told us a little about life after death in the Bible. He tells us that all human beings are eternal. After life on this earth, each of us will spend an eternity either with Him or in a place that He has also created that He calls Hell. He describes Hell as a place of constant torment, a place of infinite loneliness, a place where nobody in their right mind would want to spend a few hours, much less eternity.

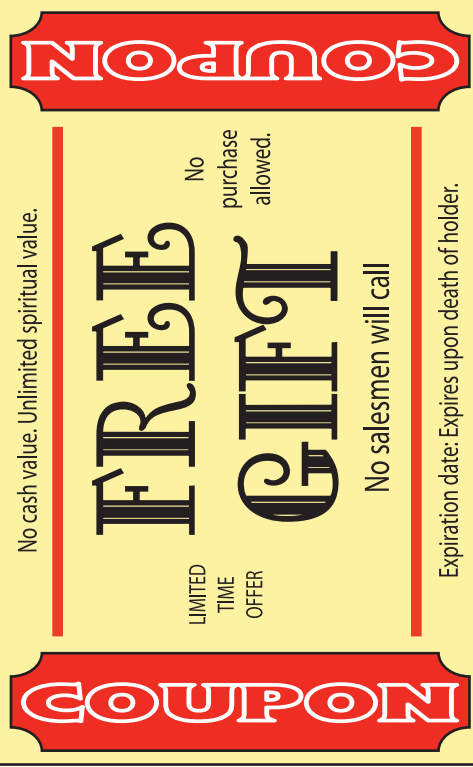
