So king Balak and his men took Bileam to the top of a high mountain where they could see God's people camping in the desert. Bileam finally realized that what God says, is really true. He started speaking good things about God's people King Balak was very unhappy and tried to persuade Balaam two more times to curse God's people. But Bileam finally realized that God's way of doing things is the best. At last he didn't use any magic. God's Spirit came on him and he blessed God's people.


## Then he said to Balak:


I think Bileam had learned a very good lesson through his donkey, what do you think?
