It's the only thing we can do to ensure the continuance of America. God gives us the standard by which He determines the "thought and intents"<sup>2</sup> of our hearts.

The Ten commandments stand as an eternal yardstick that we can use to compare ourselves. We must use these commandments, because if we judge ourselves based on the actions of our neighbors, then the standard becomes corrupted. The bible says "they who measure themselves by themselves, and compare themselves among themselves, are not wise."<sup>3</sup> If you compare yourself to some people you are relatively rich, but if you compare yourself to someone else you are relatively poor.

We need a real, unchanging standard.

So, while we are asking God to bless America, let's look at how we've blessed God by adhering to His standard.

1. Have you ever lied? In God's eyes there is no such thing as a little white lie, a story, or a fib. They are all lies. What do we call people who tell lies? A liar. Won't you admit you are a liar?<sup>4</sup>
2. Have you ever taken something that wasn't yours? Even something small, like an ink pen, a paper clip or a stick of gum? Sure you have. But in the same respect that I can not go into your purse or wallet and take out one dollar without being a thief, neither can you. God does not care about the value of the thing you have stolen. What do we call people who steal? A thief. Won't you admit you are a thief?<sup>5</sup>

You say these are all things in the past? Just as man doesn't have a statute of limitations on some crimes, God has no statute of limitations at all!

2. Have you ever taken something that wasn't yours? Even something small, like an ink pen, a paper clip or a stick of gum? Sure you have. But in the same respect that I can not go into your purse or wallet and take out one dollar without being a thief, neither can you. God does not care about the value of the thing you have stolen. What do we call people who steal? A thief. Won't you admit you are a thief?<sup>5</sup>

You say these are all things in the past? Just as man doesn't have a statute of limitations on some crimes, God has no statute of limitations at all!

3. Have you ever looked at someone and lusted? "That person is HOT!". Jesus says "if you look upon someone with lust in your heart, then you have committed adultery with him or her in your heart already"<sup>6</sup>. Men are worse at this than women, but this is yet another sin we can all relate to. We are all adulterers in the light of God's law.<sup>7</sup>
4. Have you ever been angry with someone? Sure you have. There are so many injustices today. People act and drive and live without any respect for anyone else. And that makes us angry. Jesus said if you are "angry with your brother"<sup>8</sup> then you have just committed murder in your heart.<sup>9</sup>

We would all like to think we are good people. But when we look at God's standard, we find that we are lying, adulterating thieves that commit murder. And we've only looked at four of the Ten Commandments. Can God bless America when we are like this?

Some folks have a prayer life like this. They pray their alarm works in the morning. They pray the coffeepot came on like it was supposed to. They pray their car will start. And on and on and on. As each prayer is met, they quit praying for it, because they only pray about earthly, temporary things.

But saving faith is "trusting in Jesus Christ"<sup>20</sup> alone for eternal life. Every time you sit in a chair you exercise a kind of saving faith in the chair. If you didn't think it would hold you up, you wouldn't sit in it. Or you could put on a parachute because you know your airplane is about to crash, so you exercise a kind of saving faith in the parachute. Our life is about to crash. God knows how many heartbeats we have left on this earth. The statistic is that 10 out of every 10 people die. We need to put on the parachute. The bible says we are to "put on Christ"<sup>21</sup> in the same way. Trust in Him fully. Move from trusting in our own ways, our own righteousness, and justifying our actions, thoughts and motives and replace it with full submission to God through Christ Jesus. Then the gratitude for Him paying the penalty for your sins will result in a change in your lifestyle and you'll turn from your wicked ways by your own choice. "We love Him because He first loved us"<sup>22</sup>.

Humble yourself before God. Pray and ask Him to forgive your sins. Give Him control of your life so He will heal our land. In the bargain, you'll receive an eternity in heaven. This satisfies the following commandments:

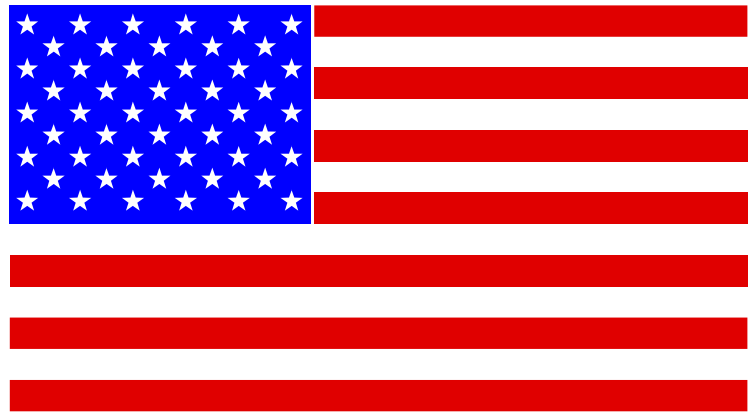

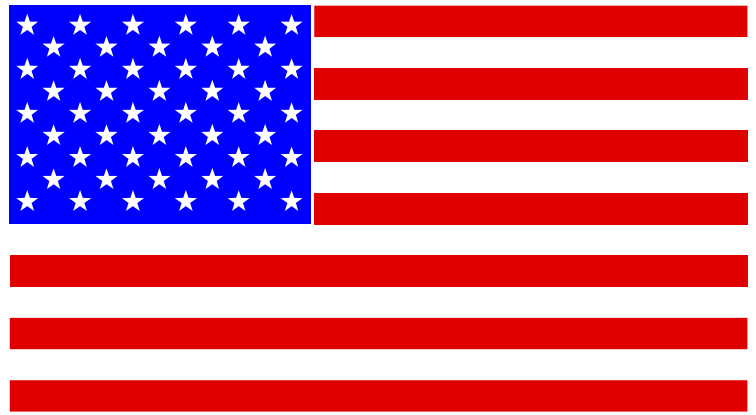
