Jesus loved little children very much! Here is what the Bible says about Jesus and little children:

“Then were there brought unto Him little children, that He should put His hands on them, and pray: and the disciples rebuked them. (They told them that they couldn’t do that) But Jesus said, let the little children come unto Me, and forbid them not: for of such is the Kingdom of God.” And then it says that He laid His hands on them.

Matthew 19:13, 14

Then in Mark 10:13-16 the Bible says, “And they brought young children to Him that He should touch them: and His disciples rebuked those that brought them.

But when Jesus saw it, He was much displeased and it’s written again that Jesus said to let the little children come unto Him and to not forbid them. “And He took them up in His arms, put His hands upon them, and blessed them!”

It’s written like this in Luke 18:15: “And they brought unto Him also infants, that He would touch them: but when the disciples saw it, they rebuked them.”

We see from these Scriptures that Jesus really loved children and gave them special attention when they were near including to pray for them and bless them.

In fact, if we all can’t love Jesus just like a little child can, we will not be able to go to Heaven when we die. The Scripture about that is in Mark 10:15 that says, Whosoever will not receive the kingdom of God as a little child shall not enter into Heaven.

Jesus loved us so much that He died on a terrible Cross so that we can be saved and be with Him in Heaven someday! Romans 5:8 says, But God introduced His love to us, that while we were already sinful, He died for us.
