(Note: that it says in this verse, in the Name, not in the plural Names.)"

The disciples understood what Jesus was saying, was to baptize in His Name, and not the Titles Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.

The disciples received Apostolic Authority to do as Jesus taught them; and as you will see from these scriptures; they understood and followed what Jesus' said.
